#### DISTRIBUTION MADE ON CHRISTMAS EVE

Gigantic Fiery Cross Blazes on Thirty-Eighth Street, Near Fair Grounds, Exactly at Midnight-Much Speculation Regarding Its Mysterious Appearance.

The Indianapolis Klan played Santa Claus to more than one hundred worthy but unfortunate families last Christmas Eve. Twelve big trucks fairly honeycombed the city and each truck, when it started was loaded to capacity with bushel baskets of groceries, candies, shoes and bedelothing. Several colored and Catholic families were on the route, the Klam making no racial nor religious discrimination whatever. Many families that were blessed with several kiddies received double portions of the gifts. Only two words were spoken by the visiting Klamsmen and they were, "Merry Christmas," as the following letter was handed in:
