LOSES FIGHT  
ON CITIZENS

Election as Planned Is Carried Out by the People—Star of Arrogant Official Is Beginning to Set as Entire State Groans Under Despotism Action of Power-Mad Chief Executive

Encouragement Is Wired Governor From Allens in All Parts of United States—Tyrannical Acts of Walton Are Reviewed—Appointment of 2,000 Men With Authority to Arm Was First Act to Bring Groans

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Oct. 2.—Jack Walton has lost his fight to keep the voice of the people of this state from being heard today, through the ballot box. His star is now beginning to set.

The state is today a vast armed camp, but there had been no bloodshed, as Governor Walton had predicted there would be, up to noon today. Armed deputy sheriffs virtually slept on ballot boxes in many counties to assure the supplies not being stolen by followers of Walton, among whom are some of the worst criminals in the state. "For the governor because of pardons received and his general pardon record which has benefited their friends and relatives," lines of voters waited this morning patiently for the polls to open.

The tide is now turning against the arrogant governor and his more than 20,000 special policemen were virtually pushed aside by the seemingly unlimited number of sheriffs and deputy sheriffs who went about their business of seeing that the election would be held.

At this hour it appears that a quiet election will be held despite the mad statements and attempted interference of the governor.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Oct. 1.—After every despotism method thought possible had been used by Governor Jack Walton in usurping the rights of the free-born citizens of Oklahoma, he once again displayed the egotistic trend of mind and took the unaided steps of refusing the voters of the state the right to vote by ballot—the only voice they now have—to convene. It would now probably take a most systematic search of the entire state to find one who honestly stated that Governor Walton's mad procedure is a fight against the Ku Klux Klan.

Local Legion Refuses  
to Condemn the Klan

After much bickering, squabbling and heated words by those opposed to the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Deputy Post No. 3, American Legion, of this city, has refused to pass a resolution condemning the Klan. In direct opposition to the resolution, the post adopted a resolution to refrain from all discussion within the post, of religious, political or racial matters.

The resolution was passed last Wednesday evening after the late resolution failed. The fight on the Klan was led by O. O. Kessing, member of the executive committee, who, he said, grew most bitter in his denunciation of the Klan. It is said that he cursed Klansmen collectively and individually and that his conversation was highly insulting to those members of the Klan organization who served overseas.

GRACEFUL EXIT IS PROVIDEDFUNERAL OF FORMER

Cortege, Headed by the Police Band, Is Almost Two Miles Long—Burial at Memorial

Service in Charge of Knights of Ku Klux Klan, Three Hundred of Whom Attend in Regalia

The funeral of former traffic officer Fred K. Russ, who died at the Methodist Hospital following an operation necessitated by attack of appendicitis, was held from his home, 1147 Villa avenue, last Saturday afternoon at two o'clock. The burial was made at Memorial Park cemetery in Washington street.

The services were conducted by Rev. Clarence Wilhelm of the Methodist Baptist Church and the funeral was in charge of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan who held services at the grave. Three hundred and six-

teen Klansmen in full regalia attended the funeral. Officer Russ, who was twenty-nine years of age, was the victim of his death, survived by a widow and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Russ. He had been a member of the police department for almost one year.

As the funeral cortege left the residence it was led by the Police and Firemen Band, followed by a detail of fifty police officers. Immediately following the detail of officers were more than three hundred Klansmen in regalia. The funeral procession was almost two miles in length.

The band and police detail escorted the cortege to Prospect street and Keystone avenue where the band stood at attention as the procession headed by the Klansmen continued on.

The sudden interest shown by Limber Lunged Lew in stopping the smashing of plate glass windows of Protestant merchants and his issuing of a permit for Klansmen to appear on the streets of Indianapolis in full regalia; his order for the police band and a police detail asked for by the Klan in the face of violent protests of Mike Glenn who assumes the rights of a czar in the police department, is not to be marveled at in view of his announcement that he is to run for governor of the state even though the statement of his intentions was plainly made by himself but by those who are running Limber Lunged Lew.

Provides Good Exit

The move, however, is possibly a good one at this time. It is the natural for Limber Lunged Lew to make should he decide positively to resign the race for governorship. And, no doubt, he feels down deep in his heart that "resigning" to make the race for governor would be a better exit as mayor of Indianapolis than other "exits" would be.

LANCASTER, O., Sept. 29.—"If I were eligible, I certainly would join the Klan!"

## FARMERS' PROBLEMS ARGUED BY SPEAKER

"Until Change Comes They  
Will Be Nationally Acute,"  
Says Federation President

KIEWANEE, Ill., Sept. 29.—"I'm not worried about the agricultural situation with the outlook for the future. If I had money to invest I would not buy stocks nor bonds. I'd go straight to the land, and put my money in agriculture."

With this simple introductory remark J. R. Howard, farmer president of the American Farm Bureau Federation, expressed his confidence in farming before more than 4,000 people who attended the tri-county meeting of farmers and business men here.

Playing Fair With Farmer?

"Is it fair that the farmers, representing a third of the population of this country, should receive less than one-seventh of the total national income?" asked Mr. Howard.

"Until this condition is remedied there will not cease to be an acute national agricultural problem. But we do not have reasons for being pessimistic over this one condition for it is fundamental. This country will never be in danger of an agricultural peasant becoming a mob of population and capital."

Basing his deduction concerning the buying power of the farmer on the last census report, Mr. Howard figures that the net output of the manufacturers of American amounts to \$27,000,000,000. The net output of the farmer is \$2,000,000,000. Before the manufacturer's products, food and coal, reach the consumer there must be added the cost of transportation and distribution.

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## CROWD AT ST. JOSEPH PLEASED WITH TALK

Fiery Cross Burns While  
Speaker Explains Principles  
of Ku Klux Klan

ST. JOSEPH, Mich., Sept. 29.—Thousands of persons attended a meeting held by the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan one evening last week on the shores of Lake Michigan near here and gave rapt attention while a well-known speaker explained the principles of the great American organization.

A jazz band in a dance hall and music from a merry-go-round in the distance, together with the japping of the waves caused the crowd to push as close to the speakers' stand as possible in order not to miss any of the inspiring talk.

The speaker said that the Klan was not an anti organization but that it had just as much right to form and operate as any other order. One man in the crowd, evidently a foreigner, took exception to some of the speaker's remarks when he was speaking for equal rights to the negro and after the speaker shouted aloud in an effort to create a disturbance, the speaker answered: "I'm making this speech, if you want to, on this platform, wait until I am through."

## IMMIGRATION LAWS GREAT AID TO LABOR

Unrestricted Flow of Foreigners Places American Worker in Hopeless Situation

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2.—All government officials interested in the working of the immigration law are pleased with the emphatic statement of Commissioner General W. W. Hubbard regarding Ellis Island conditions. He said:

"The reports of thousands of destitute aliens refused admittance, severed families, and so forth, are exaggerated and misleading. Most of these stories arise from the fact that under the present system it is impossible to count the quotas until the immigrants reach port. This means that there must often be some delay, while the quotas are being checked up, and the first report that gets out is that shiploads of immigrants have been turned back because of full quotas. Later investigation would prove many of these scare-head reports incorrect."

### Would Cut Red Tape

"Also many aliens are turned back because of restrictions having nothing to do with the quota law, which, however, usually sets the blame for it all. Last year out of 20,619 aliens, only 2,650 were returned to their countries because of quota restrictions. The remedy is, of course, a system by which immigrants would be sifted out before they embark for America. Under this system the 'red tape' which makes enforcement of the monthly

quotas such a bazaar could be done away with.

"The employer is disgruntled because he has to adjust his business to the average labor supply. In the old days he could depend on an unlimited supply for peak business. The fact that he complains of labor shortage means usually that he has not learned to adjust his business to the labor market, or that conditions in the industry are not such as to draw labor from more crowded industries."

### Does Much for Labor

"The immigration law has done more for labor than the tariff, strikes, and all the industrial legislation of recent years. It has given the laborer more continued employment, at a better wage. Unrestricted immigration put the unskilled American laborer in a hopeless situation. Labor, willing to work at any wages, under any conditions. The immigration law has raised the dignity of labor."

## NEBRASKA IS GIVEN A STATE PARK

NEBRASKA CITY, Neb., Sept. 29.—Joy Morton, of Chicago, presented Arbor Lodge, the home of his father, the late J. Sterling Morton, to the state of Nebraska (or one as a state park. Mr. Morton made the presentation speech and the address of acceptance was by Gov. Charles W. Bryan.

## CONGRESSMAN'S WINE INSPECTED BY DRYS

Representative Hill, of Maryland, Manufactures Liquor as Agents Look On

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 29.—Representative Hill, Republican, of Maryland, who has been reported for several weeks in Baltimore as making a fortune in the manufacture of liquor, has succeeded in drawing an inspection from prohibition agents to watch the progress of his efforts, and two chemists were sent from Washington to inspect his product.

According to Representative Hill's letters to prohibition headquarters, some of his constituents have had as much as 12 per cent in alcoholic content.

### To Ask for Ruling

Officials here said that apparently Mr. Hill was attempting to have the prohibition unit make a ruling on the alcoholic content necessary in a beverage to class it as "intoxicating." This never has been done, either by prohibition officials or the department of justice. It was pointed out, however, that while the Volstead act is silent on the question of what is intoxicating, it does specifically prohibit manufacture of beverages containing more than one-half of one per cent of alcohol.

Representative Hill has been one of the most outspoken critics of the eighteenth amendment and Volstead act in Congress.

## BROTHERHOOD WILL ASK WAGE INCREASE

CLEVELAND, O., Sept. 29.—General chairman of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen and Order of Railroad Conductors within a few days will present requests for wage increases of approximately 12 per cent to railroads in the eastern, western and southern sections of the country, following completion of the counting of ballots in a joint referendum vote of trainmen and conductors, which was practically unanimous in favor of presenting the wage increase proposal.

Chairmen and executive committee members of the three regional associations of the two organizations, headed by President L. E. Sheppard, of the conductors, and W. N. Deak, vice-president of the trainmen, have been counting the ballots for three days. The increase is asked to replace the practically 10 per cent wage reduction by the United States railroad labor board on July 1, 1921, President Sheppard said.

## LAW NEEDED TO CHECK ALIENS, SAYS BANKER

Sees Need of Adequate Immigration Laws to Keep Criminal Element From Shores

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Sept. 29.—The annual convention of the American Bankers' Association came to a close Thursday after installation of officers, a forum on the Federal reserve system and discussion by James H. Beck, solicitor-general, of the law which confronts America.

Mr. Beck warned of the need for adequate immigration laws to meet, he said, the situation created by the revolutionary and criminal elements in this country.

Two bills will be urged for passage at the next session of Congress, he asserted, one requiring the registration of all aliens in this country, and the other making it a crime to conspire to overthrow the national government by force and violence.

## TIME CHANGES MIND OF PUBLIC IN ATHENS

ATHENS, Ala., Oct. 2.—Six months ago two representatives of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan were ordered to leave Athens, Ala., by leaders of a mass meeting held in opposition to the Klan in that city.

Now Athens, Ala., has a Klan of more than five hundred members. Some of the speakers at the original anti-Klan meeting there are now citizens of the Invisible Empire. They admitted that they had been misinformed about the order and were glad to join it.

Athens on September 20 staged a parade and a naturalization ceremony, bringing three hundred aliens into the Klan.

## WILL ATTEMPT SALE OF SOLDIER BONUS

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Sept. 27.—An other attempt to sell fifteen or twenty million dollars' worth of Illinois soldier bonus bonds will be made within the next ten days, Gov. Len Small indicated this morning, following a conference with State Treasurer Oscar Solomon, who advised the governor there was evidently no par and recommended that the interest rate be raised to 4 1/2 per cent. The law permits as high a rate as 6 per cent.

## FORCED TO USE MODERN "WEAPONS"

(From the Literary Digest)

"To overshadow St. Peter's" and contest the dominance of Catholicism in the Eternal City, Americans of the Methodist faith are "leveling the green slopes of Monte Mario," where, as readers of "The Literary Digest" will recall, they plan to erect a great church and university. What the Catholics—and especially the Knights of Columbus—object to is the alleged endeavor to "drive the Pope out of the capital of the Catholic world," such being the phrase employed by the "Observer" Roman and quoted by a correspondent of the London "Observer," who goes on to say:

**Bible Is Condemned**

"The diffusion of the 'heretical Bible' is also condemned as being among the vulgar proselytizing methods of the Methodists, Baptists, M. C. A., and W. C. A., etc." while the pamphlets published in Italy are apparently regarded as depicting barbarous country in need of civilization do not appeal to any Italian within or without Vatican circles. The American dollar is becoming a real menace, we are told. Even if the authorities prevent new buildings from being erected the fact remains that non-Catholic schools already exist, and, as the others have been ordered to close, the new ones may end by sending their children to them, especially as there are "human comforts" such as motor cars and trips to the sea, thrown in with education.

Another gymnasium is to be opened at Ostia, or some other seaside resort. "Only Nero enjoyed as much as the Knights of Columbus will put at the disposal of everybody worthy of Rome."

**To "Force Public Opinion"**

Writing for English readers, the correspondent reviews the Italian paper's explanatory paragraphs regarding the Knights of Columbus, and we read:

"The Observer's Romano tells us that when about a hundred years ago Irish emigrants were forced to leave their country in order to escape the harsh treatment of Protestantism, they also had to suffer persecutions at the hands of enemies of their religion in America. Out of twenty millions of Catholics in the States today there is not a single Catholic in the Federal council. The Society of the Knights of Columbus was founded about thirty years ago in order to force public opinion to recognize the rights of Catholic citizens, and its members now number a million, including such notable citizens as the King of the Belgians, Cardinal Mercier and several Popes. Besides charitable work, especially among ex-soldiers, night schools, and the giving of traveling scholarships, it is surprising to learn what a lot of energy has been expended upon drawing the name of Christopher Columbus out of 'unjust oblivion.' It is said that this great Italian, and ardent Catholic, whose name was not given to America, has never been looked upon with favor by the Protestant world. The Roman society of the Holy Family have joined the American Knights as willing allies. Instead of Methodist strongholds, they hope that parks of remembrance may be planted on Monte Mario in memory of Roman soldiers who fell in the great war, and a monument erected to Christopher Columbus to remind the forgetful that he brought the light of faith and civilization to a land which is now responsible for an uncalculated outrage."

## LAWMAKERS GET INTO JURY PROBE

Stock Exchange Presents Names and Makes Allegations, Report States

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—Seymour L. Cromwell, president of the New York Stock Exchange, told the grand jury in the Criminal Courts building the names of at least four state senators and assemblymen whom he charged with having demanded favors and fees from brokers under threats of reprisal in Albany.

Substantiating his accusations made before a bankers' convention in Atlantic City that lawmakers and political pirates in this state have a habit of trying to extort either favors or money from members of the exchange, Mr. Cromwell not only supplied the names of prominent men who say they were called by telephone to present their demands, but also the names of several brokers who are ready to confirm the charges.

The names of the men in office thus accused are depicted upon the minutes of the grand jury and probably will not be made known until the investigation is completed. It is understood that several names mentioned are those of lawmakers not before suspected as being connected in any way with Wall street deals. The crimes charged are extortion.

## WAYLAY PROTESTANTS ON LEAVING CHURCH

Worshippers Accused of Being Klansmen Beaten by Aliens—No Arrests Are Made

(Special To The Fiery Cross)

NEW YORK, N. Y., Oct. 2.—No arrests had been made up to last night following the attack upon men returning from church services, and who were believed to be members of the Ku Klux Klan, in Maitland on Tuesday night.

Delegations of anti-Klansmen from Keosauqua, Keokuk and the Anshers arrived at Maitland where the alleged Klansmen had gathered in a church, without realizing, to hear a lecture by Col. William Sherman of Atlanta.

John Mulson, chief of police of Maitland, with three policemen, took positions in front of the church and warned the crowd that they would use their revolvers if necessary to protect the Klansmen from violence. The outsiders offered no violence as the Klansmen made their way to the church, with several automobiles, however, jumped into other motors and gave chase.

### Police Open Fire

Two automobiles carrying Klansmen were overtaken at Keosauqua and their occupants were beaten. A crowd was on the street because of the primaries and a general fight followed. Daniel Van Pelt, chief of police, and several policemen tried to beat back the assaults of the Klansmen. Several shots were fired into the air by the police in a fruitless effort to halt the anti-Klansmen as they escaped in their automobiles.

## THROUGH CHEERS KLAN PARADE AT AMBOY

AMBOY, Ind., Sept. 29.—The largest crowd that ever assembled in Amboy witnessed the parade here last Saturday, which was given by the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. Intense enthusiasm was shown as the marchers made their way along the line of march and there was much applause.

Preceding the parade a speech was delivered and the speaker held his audience until the very last word was spoken. His address was received very warmly by the large crowd and he was often interrupted by long applause.

The Klan is very strong in this vicinity, it is understood, and much favorable comment has been heard during the past week.

## ONE WAY TO INCREASE KLAN MEMBERSHIP

MARTINSBURG, W. Va., Oct. 2.—Rev. Sigmund H. Campbell of Atlanta, Ga., applied for a permit to lecture on "Americanism" in the public square of Martinsburg, W. Va., last week. The permit was granted.

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## LEWIS COUNTY HAS LARGE KLAN MEETING

Class of 500 Candidates Initiated While Fiery Cross Burns in W. Va. Hills

CLARKSBURG, W. Va., Oct. 2.—Before the largest crowd ever gathered together in Lewis county, a class of more than five hundred candidates were naturalized in the initiation ceremonies of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan at Jackson's Mill, Arnold park, one evening last week.

The crowd, estimated at about eight thousand, began to pour into the place as early as 5:30 in the afternoon and many extra street cars were placed on trolley lines running to the mill.

A number of speakers opened the ceremony and the speaker, addressing the crowd, outlined the ideals and principles of the order were put forth in no uncertain terms. All of the speakers were received with enthusiasm and were interrupted many times during their talks.
