KLAN SETTING FAST PACE IN CLARK CO.

Buckeye Holding Series of Meets and Membership Is Increasing at a Rapid Rate

(By Staff Correspondent) SPRINGFIELD, O., Oct. 3.—Facing a schedule of planned activities that calls for some sort of meeting practically every night, the local Klan started out Sunday night upon a campaign that will extend into the new year.

Best Speakers Secured Some of the best speakers on the national Klan lecture platform have been secured for these gatherings and the local and visiting bands and glee clubs will furnish the music.

Visiting Klansmen from Dayton, Urbana and London will increase the interest and attendance.

On Sunday night meetings were held in two local churches where large numbers of Klansmen attended in full regalia. The pastor of the Lagoda United Brethren Church was presented with a purse of \$100

to be used as the pastor and his people saw fit. The Klan glee club of fifty voices sang at the regular services of the Clifton Street Baptist Church. Their program was enthusiastically received by the congregation that packed the church.

800 Apply for Membership On Monday night an open Klansmen was held east of the city. A great crowd of Klansmen and invited guests journeyed to the field where a meeting full of inspiration was held.

A state speaker was present and gave a wonderfully vivid illustration of the founding and purposes of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. At the conclusion of his remarks the speaker invited the men who were present by invitation to affiliate with the movement. Three hundred men without a single refusal signed cards signifying their willingness to become members of the greatest American organization that has ever been founded.

Fair Has Klan Day at Bourbon, Indiana

GIVES TALK ON KLAN AT PUMPKIN SHOW

Laurelville Has Largest Crowd in History—Streets Jammed to See Parade

LANCASTER, O., Sept. 29.—"If I were eligible, I certainly would join the Klan!"

Using an expetive embellished reference from a non-eligible man after hearing the address of Rev. F. P. George at the famous "Pumpkin show" in the village of Laurelville on Klan day.

Five thousand people were assembled in the near little town just within the border line of Hocking county, at the corner of Pickaway and Ross counties, and nestled cozily between the hills at the point where Laurel creek flows into Salt creek. The latter, by the way, is not the noted stream so frequently utilized by politicians.

Largest Crowd

Never before had the annual Pumpkin show brought so great a crowd to Laurelville. The few streets were so densely packed with humanity that it was almost impossible for the big parade of robed Klansmen to pass through.

The man in question was operating a merry-go-round in the village the week of the Pumpkin show. As his attraction received no patronage while Mr. George was delivering his stirring address, amplifying the basic principles of the Klan, the skeptic decided to get "an earful" himself. He experienced conviction and conversion, and at the conclusion of the forceful speech, very emphatically made the statement quoted.

Several negroes who were operating a minstrel show at the carnival, also closed their attraction and listened to the address with re-

spectful attention. They expressed great surprise, and could hardly make themselves believe they had heard genuine Klan doctrine. They declared it was quite different from any reports they had ever heard about the principles and purposes of the organization.

Two Meetings Held

Two distinctively large Klan meetings have been held within the borders of Fairfield county the past week. The first was at Summerfield, near Millersport on Buckeye lake. The distinguishing feature was an address by the noted "Cort" of Springfield. A band and a glee club contributed materially to the success of the occasion. Two thousand attended.

Five hundred men and women were in line in the parade at a big public meeting staged Friday evening by Baltimore and Basil, the "twin cities" of Fairfield county. The parade moved through both towns. Thousands witnessed it, and attended the meeting held in a field adjacent to Baltimore. A large electric cross illuminated the scene, and an enlivening music was furnished by the Buckeye Glee club of Lancaster and the Shawnee band. Two young men have established headquarters in Lancaster to organize the Junior Knights of the Ku Klux Klan in the tri-county district of Fairfield, Perry and Hocking. Early results are encouraging and the prospects are flattering. Practically 300 members are already reported. A big klanshiave is being planned for the near future by the field directors.

"Grafted-on" Americanism

The other day John Eicht Point heard an English-born American citizen say rather sadly that if a war should ever break out between Great Britain and the United States he would feel very strongly drawn toward the land of his birth—in spite of his oath of loyalty to his adopted country. He did not of course, make it clear that he would renounce America, but he could see that the first gun of the English armaments would call to him in such thunderous tones that he might chance to forget his "grafted-on" Americanism—a garment lying loosely on his shoulders like a giant's robe.

That is one reason why American-born Americans are considered to make better citizens than even the class of immigrants who are welcomed among us as the most desirable of all imports.

In the United States an alien who wishes to be naturalized must declare on oath his intention to become a citizen of the United States. Two years later he must declare on oath his intention to support the Constitution of the United States, RENOUNCING ALLEGIANCE TO EVERY FOREIGN POWER, INCLUDING THE POWER OF WHICH HE WAS BEFORE A SUBJECT. He must also prove his residence in the United States for five years; also his residence for one year in the state where he makes application, and the fact that he has been a "good citizen." In addition, he must also renounce all oaths and agreements. It is difficult to see how a man who considers his honor could feel drawn by the bugle of a country no longer his own. Yet—the birth-pull is a strong one, and ever in the veins of any alien, however desirable, is the tug of racial blood and memory.

The Muddy Stream

One of the most encouraging pieces of news in its particular line that has been received for some time is that which states that thousands of Mexicans, now within the borders of America, are planning to return to their native country. A Texas company is planning, the news dispatch states, to move more than one thousand Mexican families back into Mexico. Special rates and other inducements are being offered. These Mexicans who migrated to the southern states from across the Mexican border were coming in greater numbers each year; many of them were "bootlegged" in and the result was that, as in all other cases where there is an influx of aliens, wages to the American worker began wabbling. The American workman can not live on the wage gladly accepted by the foreigner. The living standard of an American is naturally higher than that of the ignorant serf from foreign countries.

The American worker's greatest menace is the unending tide of humanity which flows into America, and a tide which many are prone to consider "honest" labor. It is the "honest" labor of the President of the National Chamber of Commerce, is now arguing that the country's immigration gates be thrown wide open! Every American, who is in every way a true American, knows the menace of unrestricted immigration. Quality and not quantity makes for a better nation, and with the continued reports of the unfit from Europe sweeping into America one can only be blind not to see what this "quantity" will do for America.

In a letter to the chief of police of Perth Amboy, New Jersey, the Knights of Liberty, baby brother of the un-American Unity League, with headquarters in New York City, stated that "their organization would be glad to co-operate with him at any time" and thanked him for "the heroism of his force" in the rebellion staged by the aliens of Perth Amboy, in which Klansmen and Masons and all persons having lodge buttons in view—unless they were Knights of Columbus having—were brutally beaten and mangled.

In view of the acts of the police, real Americans can well imagine that the Knights of Liberty would be glad to aid the police. The police during the riots turned the Klansmen loose in the mob after guaranteeing them protection if they left the building the rioters were storming. The entire police force failed to halt the mob, although ten members of the state constabulary broke it up in ten minutes—and upon their departure the mob immediately formed and again began to beat Protestants.

"We know," says a letter to a resident Coolidge, which the Knights claim they wrote, that the state authorities of New Jersey will do their best to legislate and thus eliminate the necessity of having to prevent violence and bloodshed on the part of Klansmen or their opponents."

Despite the "fine Italian hand" that formulated the message, one can only realize that the Knights of Liberty "knew" that New Jersey will try to legislate against an organization of true-blooded Americans because the foreign element does not want such an organization. Also, we know that the Knights of Liberty, little cousin to the Ancient Order of Hibernians, admit and acknowledge that there was riot and bloodshed and that it was started and perpetuated by their own followers.

Prominent on the advisory board of the Knights of Liberty, according to the New York Times, is Michael L. O'Connor, of the Ancient Order of Hibernians. Another member is Martin J. Healy. Other members of the board are Aaron J. Levy, Samuel Dickstein, Benjamin Antin, Samson Friedlander, Rabbi Jacob Katz, S. A. Dobszaves and Harry Knutler.

The Knights of Liberty can be easily seen to be the fusion of two elements which could not get on together. The first element, the late named gentlemen could not go into the Hibernians and the first two could not become members of a Jewish organization—which, according to their own views on the Klan, is a heinous offense—so they fused into the great Knights of Liberty. 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4,000 INITIATED AT CINCINNATI, OHIO

Crowd of 50,000 Enthusiastic Americans Gather at Huge Meet of Ku Klux Klan

The first founded our nation, constituted our civilization, built our institutions, and our representative government and it is not overstating the case that while Anglo-Saxons have themselves slanted the course against the principle of pure nationalism by Hittite slave and alien servitude...

"We have stated that southern Europe in its pioneer days succumbed to the demoralizing influence of the Semite West Asia and North Africa. It is true that as far back as the Trojan War, fought ostensibly over the fair-haired (Nordic) Helen, that war was for the control of the Bosphorus Straits and the gateway to the East from the East and down to our own day no stable government has been able to form upon the shores of either canal of the thousand years of rape and rapine that flourish to our own day, or think it due to any other cause than the fact that the Semite has destroyed original race purity. Does anyone think that the territory from the borders of Persia to the Persian Gulf, west to the Atlantic, including Greece, was entirely reaped and reaped by any of the northern peoples, that the fairest, most temperate, most beautiful of Europe would not at once become prosperous, more beautiful, the fairest of the globe? It would only if the black of Africa and the dusky Asiatics were forbidden to creep back into the life, the bed, the government of the inhabitant people.

"The Balkan that occupy the oldest, most civilized parts of Europe, yet they are today the most lawless barbarians, the most rapacious, the most inhuman. They were actually the coveted spot of the Central Powers of Europe in the World War. And what is more serious, it is to these people America—fair, Protestant America—has prostrated and continues to prostrate. We utterly unknown to our continent. In early 1900, a small brown fungus arrived here from Asia. The Hittite and the Semite quickly carried it from tree to tree. It found resting place in the chestnut tree and in less than a year it spread to the windward, not a chestnut tree remains. That is, in the vast forests of America chestnuts are wiped out by an alien parasite enemy utterly unknown to our continent. I repeat this example because it is so complete and illustrative. Similar parasites are today threatening many of the finest examples of our timber and vegetable life. That America is daily by and submit to this certain degeneracy and destruction, threatening the race itself. We were founded a free, Protestant people; Christian, independent and free in worship. We were founded with free, independent, representative government; independent as a people of religion, politics or class.

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"They have grown from hamlet through suburb to the heart of our great cities and through church and sinister leadership, negotiated not only their citizenship but our freedom and civilized life over the very center in our national Congress and there voted the destruction of our liberties. The alien, negotiable, has never been allowed to sell Anglo-Saxon American freedom in the cities into the slavery of the Semite. The Hittite and the Semite called Romish religion, which is rightfully eastern, and Egyptian. They have cut away from us the very laws of justice to all, entrenched themselves, seized and are destroying that liberty which gave them protection.

"I propose and I urge and shall bend all the influence I possess to urge upon our Congress to close completely our doors against all aliens—as a right of international privilege—for such a period as shall be dictated later by commission created by Congress and whose duty it would be to analyze the racial conditions of Europe, the political effect and result of language and ethnical influence upon artificial political groupings, investigate and publish the record of evolutionary law, abiding progress of races and the period and character of evolutionary development and its stability. Then parallel, century by century, the record of the revolutionary races, their character of their civilization, nature of their religion, character of their industries, prevalence of law and lawlessness. Then, my friends, we of America would face Europe with a record of her races and their stability, surely judge whom we should regard as citizens and of whom we should beware. But more than this, we should turn to ourselves, remembering the principles upon which we were founded and in which there still obtains a majority, and let us from census and experience just how much we have tried to absorb, how much we have become American in fact, how much does but slowly and how much does not, never can, because it does not become citizen anywhere and because racially, religiously and generically it is incapable of becoming a true member of this great Protestant republic.

"This may suggest to you anti-Catholicism but that is not so in any way. It is a question of religious and religious antagonism. I simply want you all to consider the American republic, its ideal, its principles, its constitution, the constitution of the United States could never have been conceived except by a Protestant and an independent heart. So we have here, generally speaking, two irreconcilable conditions of the human heart, which must disagree upon the fundamentals of our social life and the ultimate authority over periods of our civilization. For then there must perforce be a yielding of one or the other in America and the one that can resist will resist the growth of the other in self-protection. So that the commission, before the gates are raised, must determine upon which, how many and how much of alien indigestible races, America's Protestant representative republic of our civilization can absorb and not further retrograde. They will also determine how many and what class are need of Europe's stock.

"When these matters are determined, we would declare that we had also determined our Americanism and a new consciousness would be automatically born. Our people and naturally the doors would be flung wide open for certain of Europe's stock as desired. I further recommend that our federal government should then pass laws establishing a period of probation, education and training, which I should extend to all alien citizens and which should be mandatory. I should also recommend that a system of reward be attached to qualifying immigrants.

"I should make every immigrant a ward of the federal government until he had qualified out of three or four years—always subject to denaturalization and become a full citizen. Of course, all our immigrants should be selected abroad and not allowed to come to this country and through Ellis Island. Such a commission would know the labor, the racial condition of every part of the world, and could, if properly managed and free from political partisanship, restore the balance of vigorous peoples and wear down and absorb or eliminate the degenerate and destructive class.

"But Congress can be depended upon to pass any law, remedial to our immigration problems, unless and until the American people themselves demand relief in terms so plain that even a member of Congress can understand that the proud heritage of Anglo-Saxon civilization is being paid to be played with by political ringmasters, as a child might fondle a toy. Then you are on the verge of the crystallization of public opinion and so educate our lawmakers that they will let love of country and honor be their guide and will yield to the demands of their Master's voice, the people and save America while there is yet time."

"I am not angry but awake to consciousness of this hurt to a trusting people. I am resentful and roused. I am determined to resist. We may have to challenge our federal Congress and stop this traffic of a "citizenship" that in fact has never been given. It is a worthy citizenship. I will and you must understand the fundamental need of our nation, the spiritual demand for the protection of this quality in our constructive citizenship.

"We are the enemies of no people, of no creed, of no political isms, when applied to our country. The sons of our fathers we claim the same indigenous right to protect our soil from invasion of the Semite to our own. A duty so fundamental, so sound, that we hold there is no other basis. This is in fact the only basis for the sanctity of the home, the moral law in the family and protection in the state.

"I propose and I urge and shall bend all the influence I possess to urge upon our Congress to close completely our doors against all aliens—as a right of international privilege—for such a period as shall be dictated later by commission created by Congress and whose duty it would be to analyze the racial conditions of Europe, the political effect and result of language and ethnical influence upon artificial political groupings, investigate and publish the record of evolutionary law, abiding progress of races and the period and character of evolutionary development and its stability. IMMIGRATION LAWS GREAT AID TO LABOR

Unrestricted Flow of Foreigners Places American Worker in Hopeless Situation

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2.—All government officials interested in the working of the immigration law are pleased with the emphatic statement of Commissioner General W. W. Husband regarding Ellis Island conditions. He said: "The reports of thousands of destitute aliens refused admittance, severed families, and so forth, are exaggerated and misleading. Most of these stories arise from the fact that under the present system it is impossible to count the quotas until the immigrants reach port. This means that there must first be some delay, while the quotas are being checked up, and the first report that gets out is that shiploads of immigrants have been turned back because of full quotas. Later investigation prove many of these scare-head reports incorrect."

Would Cut Red Tape "Also many aliens are turned back because of restrictions having nothing to do with the quota law, which, however, usually gets the blame for it all. Last year out of 20,619 aliens, only 2,659 were returned to their countries because of quota restrictions. The remedy is, of course, a system by which immigrants would be sifted out before they embark for America. Under this system the "red tape" which makes enforcement of the monthly

quotas such a bugbear could be done away with. "The employer is disgruntled because he has to adjust his business to the average labor supply. In the old days he could depend on an unlimited supply for peak business. Shortage means usually that he has not learned to adjust his business to the labor market, or that conditions draw labor from more crowded industries."

Does Much for Labor "The immigration law has done more for labor than the tariff, strikes, and all the industrial legislation of recent years. It has given the laborer more continued employment, at a better wage. Unrestricted immigration put the unskilled American laborer in a hopeless situation. He could not compete with foreign labor, willing to work at any wages, under any conditions. The immigration law has raised the dignity of labor."

NEBRASKA IS GIVEN A STATE PARK

NEBRASKA CITY, Neb., Sept. 29.—Joy Morton, of Chicago, presented Arthur Lodge, the home of his father, the late J. Sterling Morton, to the state of Nebraska (or one as a state park. Mr. Morton made the presentation speech and the address of acceptance was by Gov. Charles W. Bryan.

The execution of the day included a parade, pageant, patriotic speeches, and the planting of a tree by Joy Morton before the monument erected in 1903 to his father. Ten thousand visitors attended the fair.

CONGRESSMAN'S WINE INSPECTED BY DRYS

Representative Hill, of Maryland, Manufactures Liquor as Agents Look On

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 29.—Representative Hill, Republican, of Maryland, who has been reporting for several weeks in Baltimore newspapers and in letters to Prohibition Commissioner Hayes regarding his "cellar laboratory" experiments in making elder and wine, has succeeded in drawing an inspection from prohibition headquarters. He invited prohibition agents to watch the progress of his efforts, and two chemists were sent from Washington to inspect his product. According to Representative Hill's letters to prohibition headquarters, some of his elder reached where it shows as much as 12 per cent in alcoholic content.

To Ask for Ruling Officials said that apparently Mr. Hill was attempting to have the prohibition unit make a ruling on the alcoholic content necessary to a beverage to class it as "intoxicating." This never has been done, either by prohibition officials or the department of justice. It was pointed out, however, that while the Volstead act is silent on the question of what constitutes an intoxicating beverage, specifically prohibit manufacture of beverages containing more than one-half of 1 per cent of alcohol. Representative Hill has been one of the most outspoken critics of the eighteenth amendment and Volstead act in Congress.

BROTHERHOOD WILL ASK WAGE INCREASE

CLEVELAND, O., Sept. 29.—General chairman of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen and Order of Railway Conductors within a few days will present requests for wage increases of approximately 12 per cent to railroads in the eastern, western and southern sections of the country, following completion of the counting of ballots in a joint referendum vote of trainmen and conductors, which was practically unanimous in favor of presenting the wage increase proposal.

Chairmen and executive committee members of the three regional associations of the two organizations, headed by President L. E. Sheppard, and the conductors, and W. N. Deady, vice-president of the trainmen, have been counting the ballots for three days. The increase is asked to 12 per cent, the practically 10 per cent wage reduction by the United States railroad labor board on July 1, 1921, President Sheppard said.

LAW NEEDED TO CHECK ALIENS, SAYS BANKER

Sees Need of Adequate Immigration Laws to Keep Criminal Element From Shores ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Sept. 29.—The annual convention of the American Bankers' Association came to a close Thursday after installation of officers, a forum on the Federal reserve system and discussion by James H. Beck, solicitor-general, of proposals which confront America. Mr. Beck warned of the need for adequate immigration laws to meet, he said, the situation created by the revolutionary and criminal elements in this country. Two bills will be urged for passage at the next session of Congress, he asserted, one requiring the registration of all aliens in this country, and the other making it a crime to conspire to overthrow the national government by force and violence.

TIME CHANGES MIND OF PUBLIC IN ATHENS

ATHENS, Ala., Oct. 2.—Six months ago two representatives of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan were ordered to leave Athens, Ala., by leaders of a mass meeting held in opposition to the Klan in that city. Now Athens, Ala., has a Klan of more than five hundred members. Some of the speakers at the original anti-Klan meeting there are now citizens of the Invincible Empire. They admitted that they had been misinformed about the order and were glad to join it. Athens on September 20 staged a parade and a naturalization ceremony, bringing three hundred aliens into the Klan.

WILL ATTEMPT SALE OF SOLDIER BONUS

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Sept. 27.—An other attempt to sell fifteen or twenty million dollars' worth of Illinois soldier bonus bonds will be made within the next ten days, Gov. Len Small indicated this morning, following a conference with State Treasurer Oscar Nelson, who advised the governor there was evidently no par and recommended that the interest rate be raised to 4 1/2 per cent. The law permits as high a rate as 6 per cent.

DILL YOUNGEST SENATOR The youngest man in the United States senate is C. C. Dill from Washington, age 38 years.

THE FIERY CROSS

FORCED TO USE MODERN "WEAPONS"

(From the Literary Digest) "To overshadow St. Peter's" and contest the dominance of Catholicism in the Eternal City, Americans of the Methodist faith "besting the green slopes of Monte Mario" where, as readers of "The Literary Digest" will recall, they plan to erect a great church and university. How extensive the Methodist project actually may be seen by the architect's drawing. An illustration indicates more or less clearly the distance between Monte Mario and St. Peter's. However, it appears that neither size nor distance represents the point at issue. What the Catholics—and especially the Knights of Columbus—object to is the alleged endeavor to "drive the Pope out of the city" and "take the Catholic world," such being the phrase employed by the "Observer Roman" and quoted by a correspondent of the London "Observer," who goes on to say:

Bible Is Condemned "The diffusion of the 'heretical Bible' is also condemned as being among 'the vulgar proselytizing methods of the Baptists, the M. C. A., and Y. W. C. A. etc.' while the pamphlets published in which Italy is apparently regarded as a barbarous country in need of civilization do not appeal to any Italian within or without Vatican walls. The American dollar is becoming a real menace, we are told. Even if the authorities prevent non-Catholic schools from being erected the fact remains that non-Catholic schools already exist, and, as the others have been opened on the hillside, mothers may end by sending their children to them, especially as there are 'human comforts' such as motor cars and trips to the sea, thrown in with education."

Accordingly: The Knights of Columbus have entered the lists armed with modern weapons and are meeting the enemy on their own ground. Four gymnasiums are being opened in the most populated quarters in Rome, with a swimming pool, recreation hall and grounds, baths, and two chapels for boys and girls. Another gymnasium is being opened at Ostia, for some other seaside resort. "Only Nero enjoyed as much as the Knights of Columbus the right to demolish everybody worthy of Rome."

To "Force Public Opinion" Writing for English readers, the correspondent reviews the Italian paper's expatriate paragraphs regarding the Knights of Columbus, and we read: "The Observer Romano tells us that when about a hundred years ago Irish emigrants were forced to leave their country in order to escape the harsh treatment of Protestant England, they also had to suffer persecutions at the hands of enemies of their religion in America. Out of twenty millions of Catholics in the States only there is not a single Catholic in the Federal council. The Society of the Knights of Columbus was founded about thirty years ago in order to force public opinion to recognize the rights of Catholic citizens, and its members now number a million, including such notable honorary members as the King of the Belgians, Cardinal Mercier and General Foch. Besides charitable work, especially among ex-soldiers, night schools, and the giving of traveling scholarships, it is surprising to learn what a lot of energy has been expended upon drawing the name of Christopher Columbus out of 'just oblivion.' It is said that this great Italian and ardent Catholic, whose name was not given to America, has never been looked upon with favor by the Protestant world. The Roman Society of the Holy Family have joined the American Knights as willing allies. Instead of Methodist strongholds, they hope that a park of remembrance may be planted on Monte Mario in memory of Roman soldiers who fell in the great war and a monument erected to Christopher Columbus to remind the forgetful that he brought the light of faith and civilization to a land which is now responsible for an uncalculated outrage."

"What at any rate seems certain is that the Roman children will have a good time whichever party wins."

SHOCK TROOPS LIGHTNING KILLS YOUTH

COLUMBIUS, Ohio, Sept. 29.—Victor R. Asbaugh, 17 years old, was struck by lightning and killed instantly while doing chores on his father's farm, north of Columbus.

LAWMAKERS GET INTO JURY PROBE

Stock Exchange Presents Names and Makes Allegations, Report States

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—Seymour L. Cromwell, president of the New York Stock Exchange, told a grand jury in the Criminal Courts building the names of at least four state senators and assemblymen whom he charged with having demanded favors and fees from brokers under threats of reprisals in Albany.

Substantiating his accusations made before a bankers' convention in Atlantic City that lawmakers and political pirates in this state have a habit of trying to extort either favors or money from members of the exchange, Mr. Cromwell not only supplied the names of prominent men who have said in correspondence to present their demands, but also the names of several brokers who are ready to confirm the charges. The names of the men in office thus accused are: Charles J. Smith, N. Y. C. A., and Y. W. C. A. etc. while the investigation is completed. It is pointed out that several names mentioned are those of lawmakers not before suspected as being connected in any way with Wall street deals. The crimes charged are extortion.

WAWLAY PROTESTANTS ON LEAVING CHURCH

Worshippers Accused of Being Klansmen Beaten by Aliens —No Arrests Are Made

(Special to The Flery Cross) NEW YORK, N. Y., Oct. 2.—No arrests had been made up to last night following the attack upon worshippers of the grand jury, and who were believed to be members of the Ku Klux Klan, in Matawan on Tuesday night.

Delegations of anti-Klansmen from Keopart, Keansburg and the Amboys arrived at Matawan where the alleged Klansmen had gathered in a church, without realizing to hear a lecture by Col. William Sherman of Atlanta. John Mulson, chief of police of Matawan, with three policemen, took positions in front of the church and warned the crowd that they would see their revolvers if necessary. The outsiders offered no violence as the Klansmen made their way to automobiles. The Klan opponents however, jumped into other motors and gave chase.

THROUGH CHEERS KLAN PARADE AT AMBOY

AMBOY, Ind., Sept. 29.—The largest crowd that ever assembled in Amboy witnessed the parade here last Saturday, which was given by the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. Intense enthusiasm was shown as the marchers made their way along the line of march and there was much applause. Following the parade a speech was delivered and the speaker held his audience until the very last word was spoken. His address was received very warmly by the large crowd and he was often interrupted by long applause.

The Klan is very strong in this vicinity, it is understood, and much favorable comment has been heard during the past week.

ONE WAY TO INCREASE KLAN MEMBERSHIP

MARTINSBURG, W. Va., Oct. 2.—Rev. Sigmund H. Campbell of Atlanta, Ga., applied for a permit to lecture on "Americanism" in the public square of Martinsburg, W. Va., last week. The permit was granted. Catholic influences brought about an appeal to the mayor of the city who revoked the permit. Police officers were stationed in the square to prevent any Americans gathering to hear the patriotic address should it be attempted. Dr. Campbell obeyed the mayor's ruling, however, and did not speak. This incident is set forth here merely as an example of how the constitutional right of peaceful assemblage is denied the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan in various sections of the country. They don't prevent meetings of other secret orders.

Special Session of Congress Is Asked

WASHINGTON, Sept. 29.—The wheat-growing interests of the Central Northwest, suffering from the effects of low grain prices, placed their case before President Coolidge and other administration officials, with a request that Congress be called in special session to enact legislation to revive the United States Grain Corporation.

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LEWIS COUNTY HAS LARGE KLAN MEETING

Class of 500 Candidates Initiated While Fiery Cross Burns in W. Va. Hills

CLARKSBURG, W. Va., Oct. 2.—Before the largest crowd ever gathered together in Lewis county, a class of more than five hundred candidates were naturalized in the initiation ceremonies of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan at Jackson's Mill, Aronold park, one evening last week.

The crowd, estimated at about eight thousand, began to pour into the place as early as 5:30 in the afternoon and many extra street cars were placed on trolley lines running to the mill.

A number of speakers opened the ceremonies with stirring addresses on Klandom and the ideals and principles of the order were put forth in no uncertain terms. All of the speakers were received with enthusiasm and were interrupted many times during their talks.

The issue taken by the last speaker was that of the attitude and action of Oklahoma's "mad" governor. The speaker indicated the invisible Empire with a stirring talk that brought shouts of applause and cheer after cheer from the big crowd.

At the conclusion of his speech the candidates were called to the field and Klansmen in full regalia appeared suddenly from all directions, seeming to come from out of the pines.

In the lurid glow of a large fiery cross and within the sheltering shadows of the historic hills that surround the park, the half thousand candidates were administered the oath of Americanism.

The scene was one that will never be forgotten by those who witnessed it and after all the ceremonies were over the crowd departed with the knowledge that one more step had been taken in the fight to keep America in the hands of Americans.

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CEREMONIAL IS HELD AT CONNERSVILLE

Record Crowd Views Parade With Many Features—Girls' Band Attracts Attention

CONNERSVILLE, Ind., Oct. 2.—Headed by an electric cross, hundreds of men in the regalia of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan marched through the streets of Connerville on last Thursday night. In the procession were also a number of members of the Women of the Ku Klux Klan. Many beautiful floats featured the procession and four bands had a place in the parade. The throng that viewed the procession was one of the biggest that ever gathered in this city.

Special arrangements had been previously made with Chief of Police Ketchum and the parking of automobiles was prohibited on Central avenue for several blocks during the time an address was being delivered from the courthouse steps. Klansmen aided the police in handling traffic and there were no accidents despite the great crowd.

Record Crowd at Ceremonial A record crowd witnessed the initiation of a large class of candidates at Robert's park and the crowd was much impressed with the ceremony. A minister of Richmond, Indiana, delivered an address immediately before the ceremonial and was greeted with much applause.

In addition to the Muncie Girls' Band, which attracted much attention, there were bands from Muncie, Connersville, Newcastle and Rushville. An electric cauldron from Tipon lent an added feature.

Women Make Gift to Church at Peru, Ind.

PERU, Ind., Sept. 23.—The finances of the Christian church of this city were aided last week when a substantial financial gift was made the church by the Women of the Ku Klux Klan. The minister of the church was most profuse in his thanks for the gift which was gratefully received by him.

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NEWSPAPER STORY PROVES GIANT HOAX

South Bend Opens Centennial Week With Peace and Quietude—Story in "Mouthpiece"

(Special to The Fiery Cross) SOUTH BEND, Ind., Oct. 2.—Few newspaper stories ever printed created so much excitement as the one which that story printed by the South Bend Tribune last week when, in glaring headlines, that paper told of the "huge exodus" of negroes from this city. The fact is that a few floaters and hobos left South Bend in freight trains and that was about the limit of the exodus.

Chicago papers also played up the situation and intensely magnified the true conditions and placed the blame, as is usual in such cases, on the Ku Klux Klan. There were negroes reported to have been turned off by rail officials but in no case was the number greater than twelve at any station. Due to the fact that negroes are continuously coming and going on both pleasure and business, this is about the same number that usually are found at the stations week in and week out.

"Storm of Threatening Propaganda" Amid the storm of threatening propaganda, the South Bend Forum, a negro paper, and malignant publicity that swept the city of South Bend Monday and Tuesday its citizens spent the most peaceful period of its history. Negroes went about their regular daily tasks as if nothing had been said,avoring in a great measure the threats of malicious and undesirable citizens. The propaganda had been used to terrorize the thoughtful and permanent citizen.

"One of our daily papers," continues the Forum, "magnified the rumor by carrying a glaring headline of the situation and greatly over-stating the exodus. The city of Chicago dailies persistently overtone the situation, and attributed the crisis to the propaganda of the K. K. K. In the first instance the signature of the K. K. K. was not attached to the letter."

"Mouthpiece" is balked That which would have brought about a most serious condition, had it not been for cool heads, was brought about by a wild story printed in the mouthpiece of the unannounced enemies of the Ku Klux Klan and tended to place blame on that organization. Should the publication succeed in bringing about bloodshed by its highly perverted story of actual conditions in South Bend.

The letter referred to was written to a negro citizen and, no doubt, instigated by the same minds that framed the inflammatory story in "The Mouthpiece." The letter said that "they are planning to clean up Chapin and Division streets, so put your people wise."

Centennial Week is now in full swing here and tomorrow a monster parade will be given. No trouble is anticipated and all is serene in this city. But no credit can be given the South Bend Tribune that all is peace here. The whole matter is looked upon by many of South Bend's leading citizens as another fiasco by the enemies of the Ku Klux Klan in their wild efforts to bring discredit on that organization.

KLAN TABERNACLE DEDICATED AT XENIA

Mammoth Crowd Turns Out to Hear Speaker Explain Klan Principles

XENIA, O., Oct. 3.—On Sunday afternoon most all Xenia turned out to witness the dedication of the new Klan Tabernacle in this city. Approximately 2,500 people were able to find room inside the building, while many found space at the doors and windows where they could see and hear. Many were turned away. The pulpit was decorated with the American flag, a large electric cross hung from the ceiling and three K's, one red, one white and one blue, just back of the cross but in plain view to all.

Music was furnished by the Green county band, and men and women of the organization. Speakers from state headquarters expounded the principles of the Klan and told those present of the many good things the Klan is doing. Local speakers explained the work that they are planning to do through the Tabernacle.

Rev. E. W. Middleton had charge of the arrangements for the dedication exercises and should be commended for the success of the day. Green county Klan is going steadily forward and many more fine things are expected from this part of the state.

Good Preliminaries It is possible that three or four other bouts will precede the main go. Gene Risk will appear in one of the prelims and will probably be faced by Ray Hahn. Tickets for the boxing bout have already been placed on sale at the Clayport drug store. The match will be held in the race track under a huge tent with a capacity of about 8,000.
