"There is a fact which is too much ignored by the American people and
with which I am acquainted only since I became president. It is that the

second nature among many of the people."

And, continuing, Mr. Lincoln analyzed the Roman psychology, which played its part in his own murder, when he said:

"Hence that strange want of fair play for humanity; that Implacable hatred against ideals of equality and liberty, as we find them in the Gosple of Christ-tit is true that we boucht Florida, Louislann, South Carolina, New Mexico and Missouri from Spain; but Rome had put her views of her anti-social and anti-Christian maxims into the veins of the people before they became Americans!"

Surely no clearer conception of the enemy with which that great man was contending was ever glimpsed.
