

2,000 INITIATED AT DES MOINES, IOWA

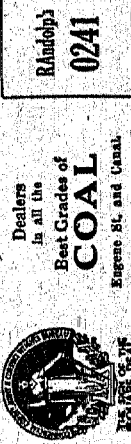
