ATTORNEY BLUNDERS AT JEFFERSONVILLE

Severe Criticism Follows Attack on Klan by N. K. Harris at Flag Day Celebration

(Special to The Flery Cross) JEFFERSONVILLE, Ind., June 23.—Severe criticism is being voiced here following the attack launched on the Ku Klux Klan by N. K. Harris, prosecuting attorney of Sullivan county, who took advantage of a flag day celebration against an American organization. Those who are members of the Klan were astonished when Harris chose as his subject for an address a denunciation of the Klan. Others who are not members were more or less surprised when Harris chose as his subject an occasion such as the flag day celebration.

In the opinion of many citizens of Jeffersonville, Harris hurled insults directly into the faces of the many Klansmen who served Uncle Sam overseas during the war. "I know where the Jew, Catholic, negro and foreign born stood during the world war, but that he wanted to know where Klansmen stood during the war. One ex-soldier who served in the trenches" during the war.

In connection with Harris' question as to "where was the Klan as an organization" during the war, it was pointed out that when the world war started the Klan was not in existence. 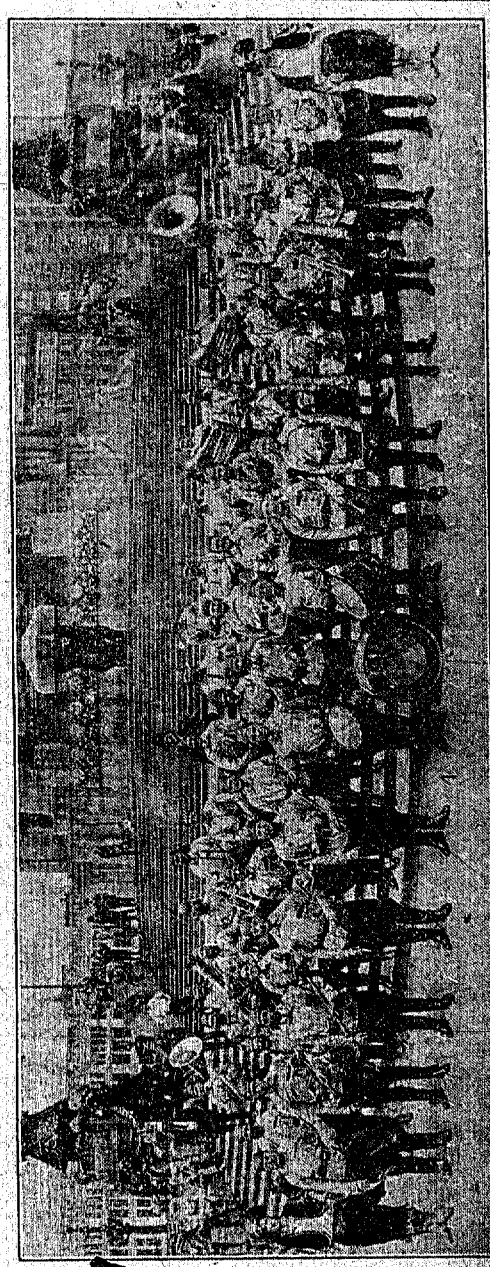

Tammany and the Schools

What happens when the hierarchy gets control of the public school system is being demonstrated in New York City. The great metropolis has a public school population of 1,000,000 pupils, the largest school population in the western world. During the past year a series of attacks on the public schools of the part of the Hyman administration which is synonymous with Tammany and the Roman hierarchy, to "drag the schools each year a little deeper into the mire of congestion and part time schooling." This according to the Christian Science.

In December 1923 Miss Margaret J. McCooey was elected principal of a Brooklyn school, but sister of "Boss" McCooey, was elected as associate superintendent of schools. Other similar appointments were made.

March 1922 an effort was made to induce the state assembly to put through a measure popularly known as "the Sports Bill," the purpose of which was to undermine the smart system in electing teachers.

It is charged that Tammany Hall has been in the background since the New York Principals' Association has raised a protest in vigorous resolutions.

So bitter did the fight become that Dr. William Underwood, associate superintendent of schools, resigned of the best known and most progressive educators in the country, resigned and accepted the superintendency of the Chicago schools.

Meanwhile part-time schools have been a disgraceful ground demoralization of the Chicago schools.

Now the news comes that Dr. William L. Rittinger, the superintendent of schools for forty years, who holds a national reputation as an incorruptible educator, has been elected to the Board of Education of the City of New York for a year.

Dr. William J. O'Shea, who was elected to the Board of Education, was educated in Jesuit universities.

No satisfactory reason can be given why the education of our youth is being neglected." "To deny it is to hold that the training of the future citizens of our republic is of less importance than a national standpoint than the development of the material resources of our country."

HUMANITARIANS WILL SPEED CHILD RELIEF

Hope Is Held Anti-Labor Act Will Become Law in Less Than Year

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 23.—The proposed amendment to the constitution, which would give the federal government power over the states having been ratified by both houses of Congress, will be proclaimed to the states by the secretary of state and will then have to be ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the states before it becomes a part of the fundamental document underwriting all American law.

Nine to Forty-eight Months
The time required is estimated to be from nine months to four years, the former being the least possible, the latter the estimate of the greatest time which should elapse.

The amendment giving women the suffrage took fourteen months for ratification by state legislatures. At that time the women's movement was a new one. Women's organizations believe that with women actively working for the child labor amendment and being able to back up their demands on state legislatures with their votes, they will succeed in having the amendment ratified in less time.

Powerful Minority
Opposition to the adoption of the amendment comes largely from those who fear the encroachment on state rights by the national government. They are determined to pass the child labor legislation as they desire without dictation from the rest of the nation. This sentiment, presented in Congress by a powerful minority, led by Senator James A. Reed, of Missouri, was the result of the arguments used by the opponents of the amendment using their children for farm and crop work.

Its speedy adoption as a plank in the Republican platform is hailed by its friends as a sign that it will pass three-fourths of the state legislatures in record time.

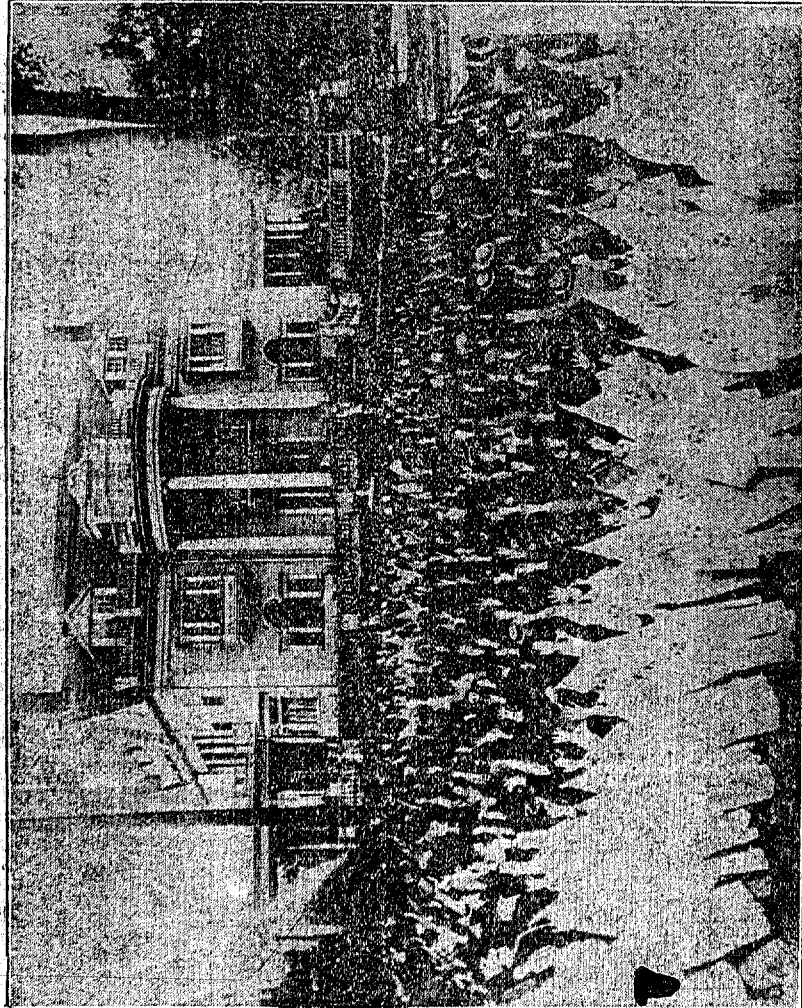
BOOK BALLAST FOR THE VACATION SHIP

Every citizen who is concerned with the future of his country means progress for a common attack upon ignorance and illiteracy through federal action is met by the alarming cry that the doctrine of states rights is in danger, that any attempt to curtail the rights of the states of illiteracy by federal department of education is an unwarranted violation of the sovereignty of the state. A little serious thought discloses three axiomatic truths:
 Little Success Attained

Secondly, there are approximately 100 million illiterate or near-illiterate over ten years of age. The California, because of the famous development enterprise he is building on the shores of the Pacific, may look with contempt and pity upon the field slums of New York, with their teeming population sunk in ignorance, superstition and squalor, but from the devaluated San Francisco and from the reeking tenements of the ghetto may arise the anarchy that may lay Los Angeles in ruins.

 Third, we are one in our prosperity and sorrow, one in our exultation and our danger, and we must meet our problems as one people.
