

Violated by Illegal Entry of Foreigners

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It is pointed out that the excess of the numbers admitted over the announced immigration quota for the year is due partly to limitations for Canada, Mexico and Central or South America. More than 40,000 came across the border as immigrants, the majority of these filling the places of farm laborers made vacant by the southward by the general exodus of many thousands came from Europe, exempted for various reasons, when their cases were carried to Washington by sympathizers. Only 53,985 emigrants left the United States, making the present population 140,000.

Settled in East

New York leads in the number of immigrants, but a marked increase is being noted in the drift of immigrants to the west and middle west. The majority of the immigrants being admitted are unskilled laborers and persons in the line of occupation. During the past year, 14,381 skilled laborers were admitted, writers and professional men, actors, and others. Among the immigrants were 1,391 clergymen (30 per cent of whom were Catholics), 714 physicians, 23,522 farm laborers, 18,750 servants, 14,000 mechanics and dealers.

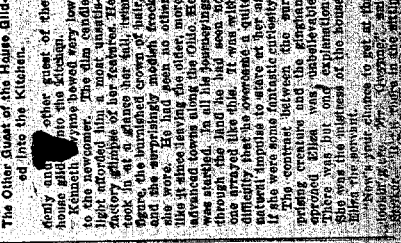

Palestine Cardinal Seeks to Prevent Presentation of 'La Juive'
CHICAGO, Sept. 1.—Press dispatches from Jerusalem announced that Roman Catholics had stopped the presentation of a world-famous Hebrew opera, in Jerusalem, because it aroused the greatest indignation among the Jews here. They do not hesitate to declare that the action taken in Palestine is typical of the methods adopted by the American when it has the upper hand.

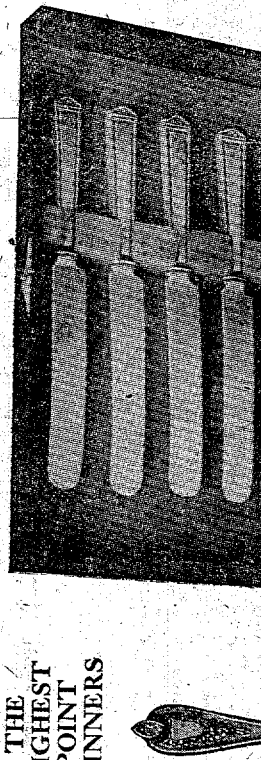
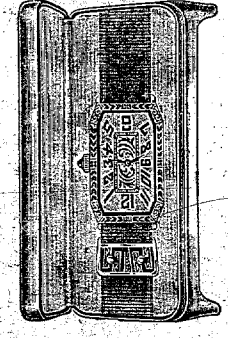
